





400 years afflicted in Egypt


Multiplied and Grew

¹⁶ if it *is* a son, then you shall kill him;


¹⁷ But the midwives feared God, and did not

BLOOD (7:14-24)

The Nile, along with all of the water in Egypt, turns into blood. But Pharaoh does not let the Israelites go.



BOILS (9:8-12)

Festering boils break out on the Egyptians and their animals. But Pharaoh does not let the Israelites go.



FROGS (7:25 - 8:15)

Frogs cover the land of Egypt. Pharaoh promises to let the Israelites go, but changes his mind.



HAIL (9:13-35)

Hail strikes down everything in the fields humans, animals and trees. Pharaoh asks for forgiveness and promises to let the Israelites go, but changes his mind.



GNATS (8:16-19)

The dust turns to gnats, which cover the people and animals of Egypt. But Pharaoh does not let the Israelites go.

LOCUSTS (10:1-20)

Locusts devour every tree and plant in the land of Egypt. Pharaoh asks for forgiveness, but does not let the Israelites go.



FLIES (8:20-32)

Flies fill the houses and land of Egypt. Pharaoh promises to let the Israelites go, but changes his mind.



DARKNESS (10:21-29)

Darkness covers the land of Egypt for three days. Pharaoh promises to let the Israelites go, but changes his mind.

LIVESTOCK (9:1-7)

All of the livestock of the Egyptians die. But Pharaoh does not let the Israelites go.




FIRSTBORN (11:1-10; 12:29-32)

Every firstborn son and firstborn of the cattle in Egypt dies. Pharaoh finally lets the Israelites leave Egypt, only to change his mind and pursue them to the Red Sea.

I.	Nile turned to blood	Exodus 7:14-25	Hapi (also called Apis), the bull god, god of the Nile; Isis, goddess of the Nile; Khnum, ram god guardian of the Nile; and others
2.	Frogs	8:1-15	Heqet, goddess of birth, with a frog head
3.	Gnats	8:16-19	Set, god of the desert
4-	Flies	8:20-32	Re, a sun god; or the god Uatchit, possibly represented by the fly
5.	Death of livestock	9:1-7	Hathor, goddess with the cow head; Apis, the bull god, symbol of fertility
6.	Boils	9:8–12	Sekhmet, goddess with power over disease; Sunu, the pestilence god, Isis, goddess of healing
7.	Hail	9:13-35	Nut, the sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops and fertility; Set, god of storms
8.	Locusts	10:1-20	Nut, the sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops and fertility
9.	Darkness	10:21-29	Re, the sun god; Horus, a sun god; Nut, a sky goddess; Hathor, a sky goddess
10.	Death of the firstborn	II:I-I2:30	Min, god of reproduction; Heqet, goddess who attended women at childbirth; Isis, goddess who protected children; Pharaoh's firstborn son, a god








The Broken Covenant Ex 32-34











Luke 24:27 And beginning at **Moses** and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning **Himself**.

Luke 24:44 that all things must be **fulfilled** which were written in the **Law of Moses** and *the* Prophets and *the* Psalms **concerning Me**." ⁴⁵ And He opened their understanding, that they might comprehend the Scriptures.

Acts 28:23 persuading them **concerning Jesus** from both the Law of **Moses** and the Prophets, from morning till evening.

Heb 8:1-2 We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, a Minister of the sanctuary and of the **true tabernacle** which the Lord erected, and not man.

8:5 the priests who serve the **copy and shadow** of the heavenly things, as Moses was divinely instructed when he was about to make the tabernacle. For He said, "See *that* you make all things **according to the pattern** shown you on the mountain.

Pattern – (Tupos) type, stamp, print, shape, statue, sample, model, analogy, example, figure, pattern

Heb 9:8 the Holy Spirit was indicating that the way into the Holiest of All was not yet made clear while the first tabernacle was still standing.

9:9 It was symbolic for that present time in which both gifts and sacrifices are offered which cannot make him who performed the service perfect in regard to the conscience

(Parabole – parable, story to bring out one main truth)

Heb 9:23-24 Therefore *it was* necessary that the **copies** of the things in the heavens should be purified with these, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these.

9:23 For Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us


Hypodeigma – imitation, example, pattern **antitupon** – representative counterpart

Gen 15:14 Come out with a great substance


Ps 105:37-38 He also brought them out with silver and gold


